## WORD OF THE DAY: Umbrage

1. A feeling of pique or resentment at some often fancied slight or insult
2. Shady branches: foliage
3. Shade, shadow
4. A. an indistinct indication: vague suggestion: hint  
B. A reason for doubt: suspicion

Deare amber lockes gave umbrage to her face." This line from a poem by William Drummond, published in 1616, uses *umbrage* in its original sense of "shade or shadow," a meaning shared by its Latin source, *umbra*. (*Umbrella*, the diminutive form of *umbra*, means "a sunshade or parasol" in Latin and is an ancestor of our word *umbrella*.) Beginning in the early 17th century, *umbrage* was also used to mean "a shadowy suggestion or semblance of something," as when William Shakespeare, in *Hamlet*, wrote, "His [semblable](#) is his mirror, and who else would trace him, his umbrage, nothing more." In the same century, *umbrage* took on the pejorative senses "a shadow of suspicion cast on someone" and "displeasure, offense"; the latter is commonly used today in the phrases "give umbrage" or "take umbrage."
