WORD OF THE DAY: **Largesse**

1. Liberal giving (as of money) to or as if to an inferior, also: something so given
2. Generosity

The word *largesse*, which also can be spelled *largess*, has been part of the English language since at least the 13th century. It derives via Anglo-French from the Latin word *largus*, meaning "abundant" or "generous." *Largus* is also the source of our word *large*. As far back as the 14th century, we used the

word *largeness* as a synonym of *largesse* (meaning "liberal giving"), but *largeness* was also at that same time being used more frequently as it is now: to refer to physical magnitude and bulk rather than to magnanimity.
