- **Hey Seniors! If you're 18 or over**, you still have time to register to vote in the upcoming midterm elections. The State of Vermont allows you to register to vote online at <https://olvr.sec.state.vt.us/?ref=voteusa>, and you can register in person before and on the day of the elections. Once you are registered, you can use "My Voter Page" for information on where you can vote, your registration status, and more. The election takes place on Tuesday, November 6. Polls open between 5:00 and 10:00am according to the VT Secretary of State's website, and all close at 7:00pm. It's a quick and easy way to get involved. Know that your vote does count! (Yeah, we know, it seems cheesy but it's true!) ### **WORD OF THE DAY: Nonchalant**

#### **Having an air of easy unconcern or indifference**

Since *nonchalant* ultimately comes from words meaning "not" and "be warm," it's no surprise that the word is all about keeping one's cool. The French word *nonchalant*, which strolled into English in the 1700s, has essentially held the same meaning in English as in French. It was derived from the Old French verb *nonchaloir* ("to disregard") and can be traced back to Latin *non* ("not") and *calēre*, meaning "to be warm." *Unconcerned* is one synonym of *nonchalant*, along with *casual*, *complacent*, and *insouciant*.
