There's no shortage of words to describe wordiness in English. <u>Diffuse, long-winded, prolix, redundant, windy, repetitive, rambling, and circumlocutory</u> are some that come to mind. Want to express the opposite idea? Try <u>succinct, concise, brief, short, summary, terse, compact, or compendious</u>. Verbose, which falls solidly into the first camp of words, comes from Latin <u>verbosus</u>, from <u>verbum</u>, meaning "word." Other descendants of <u>verbum</u> include <u>verb, adverb, proverb, verbal, and <u>verbicide</u> (that's the deliberate distortion of the sense of a word).</u>
