News from the Direction Center

- **College Awards**--Several colleges have a program which recognizes juniors who demonstrate exceptional promise. The criteria vary from school to school. Some awards recognize community service, some recognize leadership, others recognize outstanding achievement in a specific content area. Below is a list of awards we have received so far this year. If you are interested in nominating yourself, please pick up an application in the Direction Center. The deadline to apply for these awards is **March 30th**.
- Brandeis Book Award- Recognizes an excellent Junior who has demonstrated a commitment to civic engagement, community service, political activism or volunteer work.
- Clarkson Achievement and Leadership Awards- These awards offer a substantial merit scholarship if the student attends Clarkson. Students must have demonstrated an interest in engineering, business, science or liberal arts.
- RPI Medal -for a student who has excelled in advanced math and science courses and has exhibited significant involvement in extracurricular activities.
- Rochester Institute of Technology- 2 awards each given to one male and one female student and offers merit scholarship money if the student attends RIT.
- Computing Medal Award
- Creativity and Innovation
- St. Lawrence – Recognizes community service & academic achievement
- St. Michael's Book Award – Academic achievement with a social conscience. Student must be eligible to be a member of NHS and demonstrate a sincere commitment to community service.
- University of Chicago - The foundation of academic experience at Chicago is the Core Curriculum, through which all undergraduates explore fundamental questions and ideas through interdisciplinary coursework, independent research, and vigorous classroom discussion. The recipient should be a student who looks beyond traditional answers to discover original solutions to complex questions. Candidates should be students in their junior year who are among the strongest in their class. These are students whom the faculty would label “scholars” with a “lively mind.” Finally, candidates should be visible members of the student body as a result of their contributions and commitment to their high school community or their greater community.
